# All-Hazard Alert Broadcast Sirens



The all-hazard alert broadcast sirens are intended to act as an outdoor emergency alerting method for people who are outside.

The sirens will play 3 different tones depending upon the type of emergency, followed by a message providing further information.

**Test Chime**

Weekly 20-second test

**Alt Steady**

Flood, tsunami, fire, high wind, blizzard, shelter-in-place, or immediate evacuation

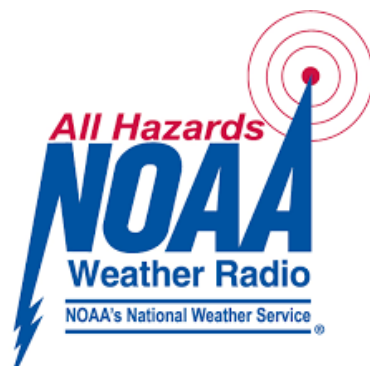
**Pulsed Steady**

Amber Alert (child is abducted/missing)

**NOAA Weather Radios** broadcast official Weather Service warnings, watches, forecasts and information for all types of hazards 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

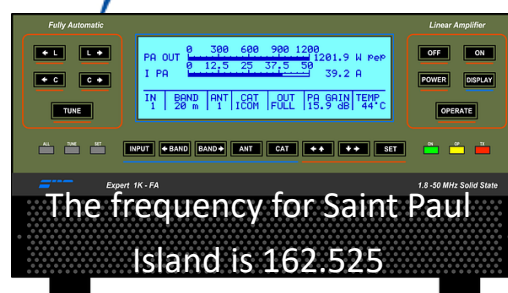
Weekly tests occur Wednesdays between 10 am and noon.
